Johana Garzón (Colombia) reinforced the message as she explained that closer collaboration between IACLE and FEDOPTO in recent years has been beneficial in strengthening contact lens education.

Massive Student Trial Exam planned for Latin America

During the next <u>FEDOPTO Conference</u> on 5 August, IACLE and the FEDOPTO Board have agreed to invite students from the eight optometry programs in Colombia to join a massive sitting of the IACLE Student Trial Exam (STE). Heads of optometry schools have received the invitation and optometry programs from <u>Areandina</u> (Pereira) and <u>Universidad Antonio Nariño</u> (Bogotá and Medellin) have already joined their students up for this initiative. We expect to have all Colombian schools involved.

The STE is a very good diagnostic tool of the impact of educators on their students and allows educators to assess contact lens knowledge by area. Educators can then establish strategies to remediate weak areas, leading to better contact lens practitioners in the future.
