The optometry fraternity from all over India assembled together for the biggest Optometry Conference ever held in Kolkata, along with an optical trade fair at the Science City Auditorium & Milan Mela ground (16 and 17 April). The Kolkata Optometry Conference was jointly organised by West Bengal Association for Optometrists and Graduate Optometrists Association, Kolkata.

About 650 delegates attended including optometry professionals from all over India and neighbouring countries such as Bangladesh and Nepal. Optometry students from various colleges in India also took part. The conference was designed with scientific sessions, workshops, and poster and model competitions. Separate sessions were held for students and included a free paper session.

The contact lens session was enriched by the presence of the FIACLEs and IACLE members, some of whom have been actively involved in contact lens teaching and practice for more than 20 years. **Amod Gogate, Yeshwant Saoji, Lakshmi Shinde, Professor Monica Chaudhry, Nilesh Thite and Jayanta Bhattacharjee** emphasised different aspects of contact lens education and practice that was very helpful for the future graduates in optometry who are interested in contact lenses. They discussed the benefits and barriers to contact lens practice and shared tips on how to become a successful contact lens practitioner.
