


Haiying lectures live to more than 8,000 optometrists in China...

The 6th Optometry Forum of China Optometry Development Education (CODE) was conducted on 23 May. This forum invited IACLE China National Coordinator **Professor Wang Haiying** (pictured) and seven other professional teachers to share their theoretical and practical skills with optometry professionals. Haiying spoke on 'Soft multifocal contact lens fitting'.

The forum was sponsored by the optometrist branch of <u>China Optometric & Optical Association</u> National Optometry Guidance Committee, organized by <u>Tianjin Vocational</u> <u>Institute</u> and co-organized by *China Glasses Science-Technology* magazine.

Haiying used IACLE resources to introduce the principles of concentric bifocal soft lenses and progressive soft lens technology, as well as details of designs and applications. The aim was to help practitioners apply relevant technical details in their future work.

During the three-hour live broadcast, more than 8,000 people watched online. The live broadcast not only attracted

Fifteen IACLE members from 12 universities in Korea attended an online meeting via Zoom to discuss how to use the <u>IACLE Case Report Series</u>. During the session, Korea National Coordinator **Professor Kyounghee Park** explained the process for accessing the Member Login section of our website and showed members the case reports.

Kyounghee presented, as an example, IACLE Case Report No 14 – A corneal lesion – since this particular case can help students to understand corneal diseases better.

Further discussion centered on how to prepare optometry students for the coming <u>Student</u> <u>Trial Exam</u>. Besides the IACLE Case Report Series, she also encouraged members to download the new <u>IACLE Contact Lens Course</u> (ICLC) modules, in particular Module F: Myopia and its Management.



Friday lectures continue in India and students take part

A series of online Friday lectures by Indian FIACLEs – facilitated by Director of Global Education **Lakshmi Shinde** and Director of Educational Programs **Nilesh Thite** – continued last month with two presentations by **Dr Richa Verma** from the L V Prasad Eye Institute in Hyderabad.

Dr Richa Verma joined the IACLE webinars as a guest lecturer and presented on 'Problembased learning: an introduction' on 8 May. A total of 25 members from 22 institutes participated in this interactive session.


Following demand from the members, Dr Verma returned on 22 May and presented on 'How to design active learning'. A total of 24 members from 19 institutes attended this session.



Lakshmi and Nilesh also conducted four webinars for educators and their students at six priority institutes. Lectures were on 'How can I benefit from IACLE?' The six institutes were: <u>Dr</u> <u>D Y Patil Institute of Optometry & Visual Sciences</u>, <u>Hari Jyot College of Optometry</u>, <u>Shree</u> <u>Bharatimaiya College of Optometry</u>, <u>Laxmi College of Optometry</u>, <u>Ahalia School of Optometry</u> and <u>Amity University</u>. Twelve educators and 222 students attended the webinars.
