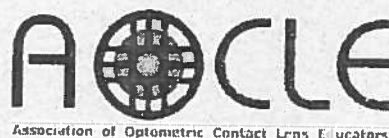


Dear Delegate

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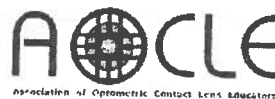

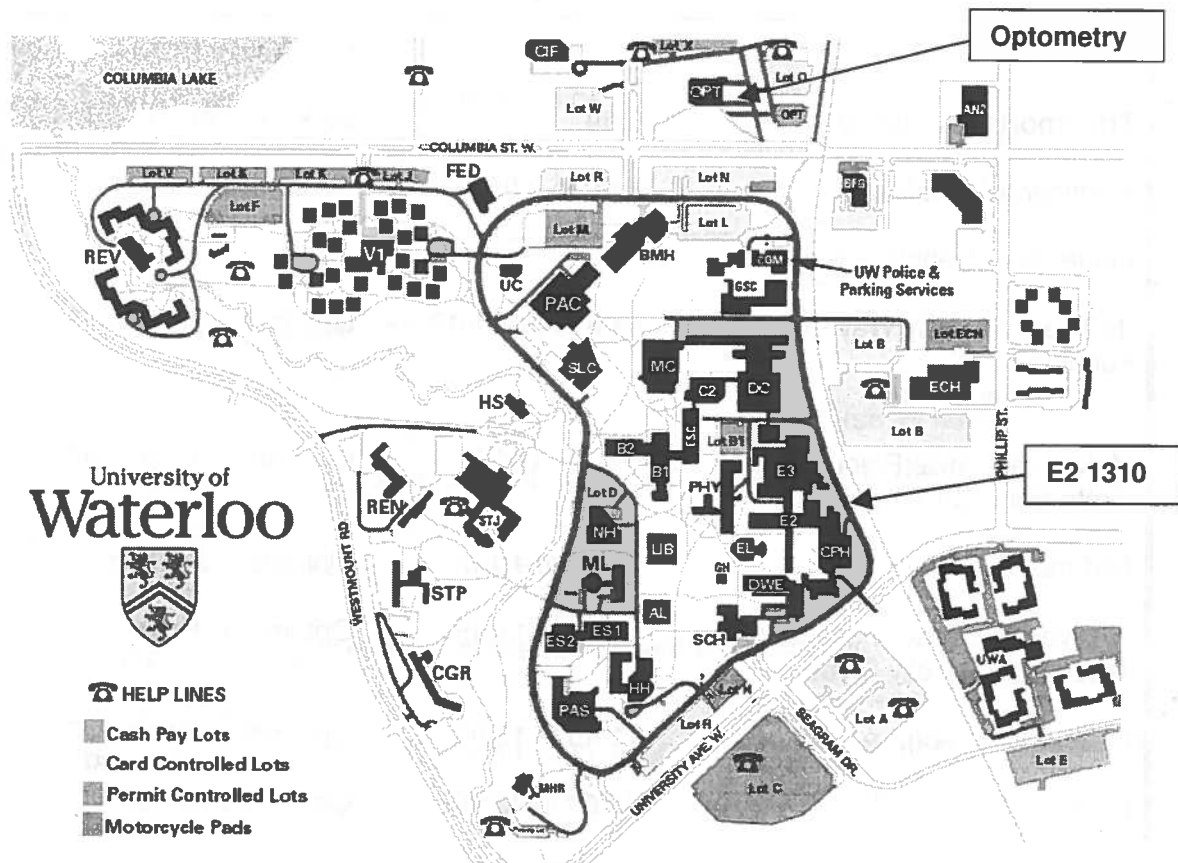

The Laurel Trail

The Laurel Trail is 6.5km (one way) from Uptown Waterloo to Laurel Creek Conservation Area. Some of the places you can visit along the Laurel Trail:

Waterloo City Centre

The Waterloo City Centre on Regina Street is the point where Laurel Creek re-emerges after being channeled underground below the surface of Uptown. Also the trailhead for the Laurel Trail.

Cenotaph

Originally located in Memorial Park this memorial was dedicated on November 3, 1957 in honour of the men and women of Waterloo who served in the Canadian armed forces in World War I, World War II, and the Korean War.

Canadian Clay and Glass Gallery

***About 30 min walk from the University GOOD GIFT SHOP AS WELL**

The Gallery is dedicated to preserving contemporary Canadian clay, glass and stained glass, and enamel art as part Canada's cultural heritage for future generations.

Abraham Erb's Mill

This replica of a nineteenth century grist mill is a celebration of the entrepreneurial spirit of Waterloo's first resident, Abraham Erb. First built in 1816 the grist mill became an important economic and social centre for the region encouraging the creation of settlement that eventually grew to the Waterloo we know today. The "new" 150 year old mill features timber frame construction, the use of local materials, including 300 year old hand hewn oak, elm, cherry and pine beams, as well as a 3.6m (12ft) waterwheel.

Waterloo Park

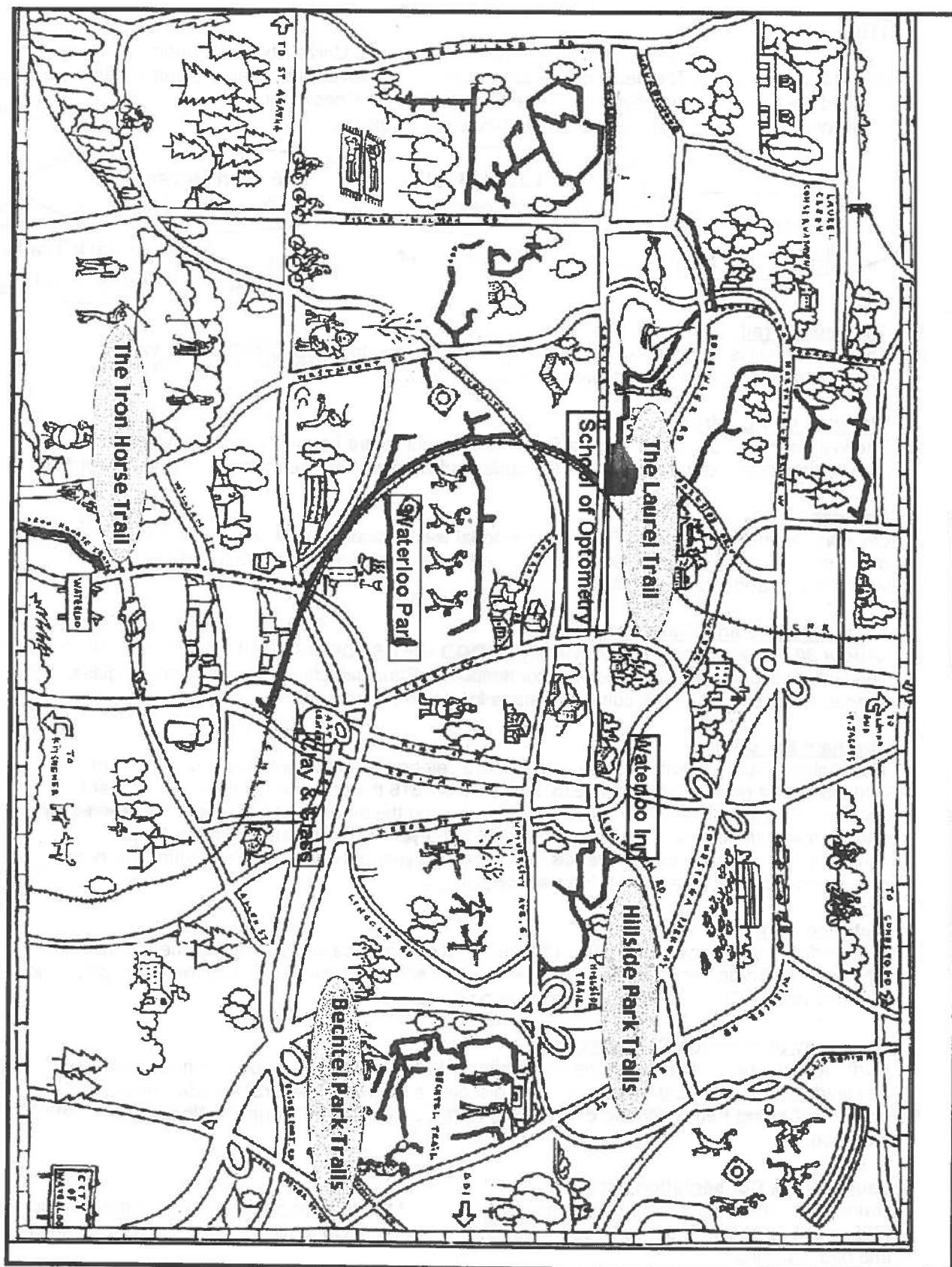
In Waterloo Park discover over 50ha (100acres) of greenspace in the centre of the city including, the Victorian Garden, the Eby Farm, Waterloo's first school house, Lion's Lagoon water park, and a scenic view of Silver Lake as you travel along the 'promenade.'

University of Waterloo/Columbia Lake

North of Waterloo Park, through the University of Waterloo south and north campus, the Laurel trail leads to Columbia Lake where you will discover **a setting of natural wooded areas preserved along Laurel Creek, connecting to the Laurel Creek Conservation Area** in north Waterloo.

Laurel Creek Conservation Area

Swimming, windsurfing and group picnicing are three of the most popular activities at the 294 ha (725acre) Laurel Creek Conservation Area. Other activities include hiking, non-motorized boating and bird watching.

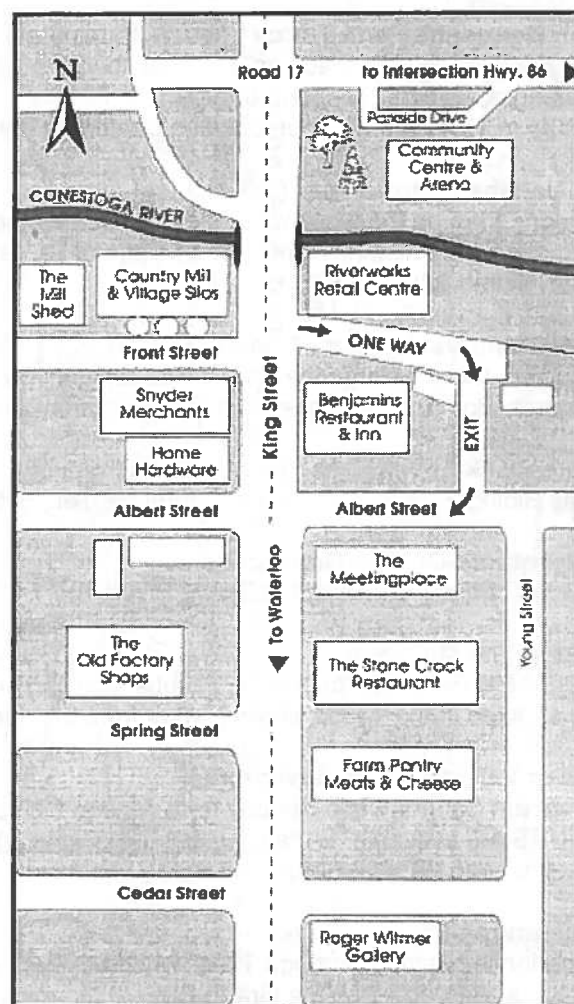
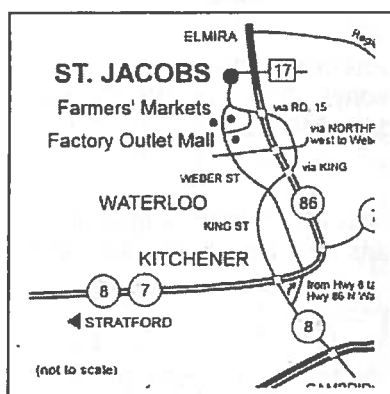
