IACLE makes its mark at largest ever Academy meeting

IACLE members and Fellows were involved throughout the program at Academy 2018 in San Antonio, Texas, USA, where the association also held a Strategic Planning Meeting and its Annual General Meeting. Alison Ewbank reports on a very successful event for IACLE



IACLE Board, staff, members, Fellows and industry heard a review of IACLE activities in 2017 at the Annual General Meeting held to coincide with Academy 2018

With almost 8,000 attendees, Academy 2018 San Antonio (7-10 November) was the largest in the 97 years of the American Academy of Optometry's annual meeting.

Registrants included 4,625 optometrists and vision scientists, and 1,168 students. Attendees engaged in continuing education sessions, experienced new products and technologies in the exhibit hall, and learned about the latest in vision research.

Key themes this year were around the future for patient care, with developments such as new imaging techniques and the use of augmented reality for clinical assessment and education. In the contact lens field, the most prominent new product was the first photochromic contact lens, Acuvue Oasys with Transitions Light Intelligent Technology, available from 2019 and recently chosen as one of *Time* magazine's Best Inventions of 2018.

In education, the Brien Holden Vision Institute launched its Global Myopia Centre, an online resource for eye care practitioners to be headed by **Professor Padmaja Sankaridurg**. Another familiar name in the contact lens field, dry eye specialist **Dr Barbara Caffery**, was inducted as the new President of the Academy for 2019-2020. And the Glenn A Fry Lecture Award was presented to **Professor Fiona Stapleton** of the University of New South Wales, Australia.

IACLE had a strong presence at this year's meeting and throughout the program. Here's a photo round-up of some of the key events in which our members and Fellows were involved:



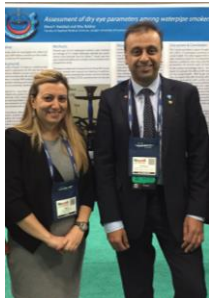

Dr Bence said that 25 of the new Academy Fellows were from outside the US, from 10 different countries. International attendance made up 8-10% of Academy attendees.
